THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THAMES CENTRE

BY-LAW NO. 62-2022

Being a By-law to regulate the display and the discharge of fireworks within the Municipality of Thames Centre.

FIREWORKS BY-LAW

WHEREAS Section 5(3) of the Municipal Act, 2001, provides that the powers of The Corporation of The Municipality of Thames Centre, shall be exercised by by-law;

AND WHEREAS Section 121 of the Municipal Act, 2001, authorizes a municipality to prohibit and regulate the sale of fireworks and the setting off of fireworks;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Thames Centre deems it desirable to pass a By-law to prohibit and regulate the sale of fireworks and the setting off of fireworks within the Municipality of Thames Centre;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Thames Centre **HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS**:

1. **DEFINITIONS**

In this by-law:

"banger" means a type of firework that is made to explode noisily without a spectacular display of colour or lights.

"firecracker" means a type of firework that is made to explode with a sharp crack without a spectacular display of colour or lights.

"fireworks" means any and all classes of fireworks with the exclusion of sparklers, including and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the following clauses which are included in the Explosives Regulation, Natural Resources Canada:

- (i) Consumer fireworks are low-hazard and designed for recreational use. They include items like Roman candles, fountains, volcanoes, mines, and snakes.
- (ii) Display fireworks are high-hazard and designed for professional use. They include items like aerial shells, cakes, Roman candles, waterfalls, lances, and wheels.
- (iii) Special effect pyrotechnics are high-hazard and designed for professional use. They include items like gerbs, mines, comets, and crossettes, as well as special-purpose pyrotechnics made for live stage performances and the film and television industry.

"fireworks composition" shall mean any chemical compound or mechanically mixed preparation of any explosive or inflammable nature that is used for the purpose of making any manufactured fireworks and is not included in any other class of explosives and includes any star or coloured fire composition that is not manufactured fireworks.

"manufactured fireworks" shall mean explosives of any class and any fireworks composition that is enclosed in any case or contrivance, or is otherwise manufactured or adapted for the production of pyrotechnic effects, pyrotechnic signals or sound signals.

"Municipality" means The Corporation of the Municipality of Thames Centre. "Officer" is defined as:

- (i) Any Police Officer;
- (ii) A By-Law Enforcement Officer so designated by the Council of the Municipality of Thames Centre;
- (iii) The Fire Chief.

2. **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

- 1. No person shall, within the Municipality, sell or give to any person under the age of 18 years any type of fireworks;
- 2. No person shall display for sale within the Municipality any type of fireworks in any manner other than in lots that do not exceed 22.68 kilograms gross weight (50 pounds gross weight);
- No person shall display for sale within the Municipality any type of fireworks in any manner other than in a package, glass case or other suitable receptacle and away from any other flammable goods;
- 4. No person shall display for sale within the Municipality any type of fireworks in any manner other than in such a place that the fireworks are not exposed to the rays of the sun or to excess heat from any other source;
- No person shall within the Municipality of Thames Centre, display or sell any type of fireworks except upon the three (3) business days prior to and on the days upon which Victoria Day, Canada Day and the third day of Diwali are celebrated as holidays;
- 6. No person shall permit anyone under the age of 18 years to set off or discharge any type of fireworks in the Municipality;
- No person shall within the Municipality discharge any type of fireworks on any day other than the days upon which Victoria Day, Canada Day and the third day of Diwali are celebrated as holidays;
- 8. No person shall within the Municipality discharge any type of fireworks at any time other than dusk until 11 o'clock in the evening, local time;
- 9. Notwithstanding the provisions of this By-law, the Municipality may hold special displays of fireworks to celebrate national or civic holidays or national celebrations provided such displays, in each case, are organized, constructed, lighted, set off or discharged under the supervision and in accordance with the directions of the Fire Chief of the Municipality and a pyrotechnical expert.

3. **GENERAL PROHIBITIONS**

- 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of this by law, no person shall, within the Municipality, display, offer for sale, or sell firecrackers or bangers;
- 2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this by law, no person shall let off or discharge within the Municipality firecrackers or bangers;
- 3. No person shall, within the Municipality, display in any store window, or display outside the perimeter of the store's exterior walls, any type of fireworks;
- 4. No person shall, within the Municipality, display or sell fireworks from vehicles or other means located on parking lots or residential property unless approved by the Municipality's Fire Chief;
- 5. No person shall discharge any fireworks on land owned by the Municipality without written consent from the Chief Administrative Officer of the municipality, the provision of liability insurance in the amount of \$5,000,000.00, and naming the Municipality as an additional insured.

4. **DISPLAY – PERMIT**

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of this by-law, any incorporation having a continuity of existence and organization shall be entitled to apply for a permit from the Chief of the Fire Department of the Municipality for the holding of a fireworks display, subject to compliance with the requirements set out in

Sections 4.2 to 4.6 inclusive of this by-law;

- 2. Applications for such permits shall be in writing addressed to the Chief of the Fire Department of the Municipality and shall set out the name and address of the applicant and full particulars of its qualifications for permit;
- 3. The applicant shall state the day for which the permit is desired and the location where such display is to be given;
- 4. The location referred to in Section 4.3 of this by-law must be such that there can be no danger to adjacent properties or highways or persons using the same;
- 5. The fireworks display shall be held between dusk and 11 o'clock in the evening, local time, on the day for which the permit is issued unless the permit states that the display may be held between such other hours as are specified therein;
- 6. The name, qualification and experience of the person to discharge the display shall be given, and the person shall be a pyrotechnical expert and/or possess a certificate as a recognized fireworks supervisor;
- 7. If an exemption is denied by the Fire Chief, the individual, organization or association may appeal the decision to Council within ten (10) business days of the written decision provided by municipal staff. The appeal must be made in writing and addressed to the Fire Chief of the Municipality. Council shall consider the appeal, which will be accompanied by a report from the Fire Chief at a regularly scheduled meeting of Council.

5. **ENFORCEMENT**

- Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an
 offence and upon conviction is liable to any penalty as provided in the
 Provincial Offences Act and subject to the fines noted under Schedule "B" of
 this By-law.
- 2. Subsequent violations of this by-law are subject to further penalty;
- 3. Pursuant to the authority established in section 429(2) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c. 25, every person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction pursuant to Part III of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P.33, as amended, shall be subject to the following penalties:
 - (a) Upon a first conviction see Schedule "B"
 - (b) 2nd offence \$1,000
- 4. The provisions of this by-law shall be enforced by an Officer.
- 6. **THAT** this By-law may be cited as the "Fireworks By-law";
- 7. **THAT** Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-law sets out 'Application for Discharge of Fireworks' requirements and application for those matters contained within the schedule to this By-law;
- 8. **THAT** the Fire Chief be authorized to amend Schedule "A" of this by-law as required;
- 9. **THAT** By-law 70-2021 is hereby repealed;
- 8. **THAT** this By-law shall come into force and take effect upon the final passing thereof.
