## New Food Truck By-Law Passed

Council passed a new by-law last night that increases flexibility for operators of refreshment vehicles!

A license is now only needed if a refreshment vehicle will operate on municipal property. No license is needed for operating on private property.

The new by-law also adds an option for a \$60 3-day licence, instead of only offering an annual licence for \$190.

These changes will make it easier for refreshment vehicles to do business in Thames Centre!
